TREATMENT:

DO'S& DON'TS

DO:

puncture-resistant container. Place sharps in an opaque,

garbage can with other wastes.

- Seal lids on containers of sharps with heavy-duty tape
- Seal trash bags with tape or wire/plastic ties.
- Label plastic jug or metal can "DO NOT RECYCLE"
- Keep waste containers animals. out of reach of children and

DON'T:

- Place loose sharps in the trash or toilet.
- Label the containers as medical waste.
- Clip needles with a pair of scissors.
- Place sealed containers in with recyclables
